

A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Please use the SignUp Genius link

https://tinyurl.com/5nmmm5ky to sign up for FOOD DONATIONS.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time BEFORE the WEDNESDAY preceding the SECOND THURSDAY of the month.

**PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT** in the bin **ON THAT WEDNESDAY,** by 7:30am, to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to SERVE the FHC lunch on that SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and cleanup. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp Genius link <a href="https://tinyurl.com/5nmmm5ky">https://tinyurl.com/5nmmm5ky</a> to volunteer.

The date of "FHC's Thursday" will be posted each month at SignUp Genius and in this bulletin. The next donation date is WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 10, for the lunch that will be served on THURSDAY, JANUARY 11.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to 75-125 households every week. Donations of NON-PERISHABLE ITEMS such as canned chicken and tuna, peanut butter, cereal, rice, pasta, canned tomato products, fruit, and soups, kosher food, and low-sodium food, are ALWAYS welcome. Donations may be put any time in the Bell Tower AJH bin.






