

- 1. (a) This famous saying of Jesus is from his teaching called the Sermon on the Mount. See Luke 6:31.
- **2. (c)** The words of the Sign of the Cross honor the Holy Trinity and strengthen us in our work and prayer.
- **3. (d)** Christians celebrate the Lord's Day on Sunday because that's the day Jesus rose from the dead.
- **4. (a)** The commandments are a sign of the covenant, or solemn agreement, that God made with his chosen people. God promised to take care of his people and they promised to follow God's commandments.
- **5. (c)** When God spoke with Moses on Mount Sinai, he gave Moses Ten Commandments for all of Israel to observe. You can read the commandments in Deuteronomy 5:1-21.
- **6. (c)** You can read the Beatitudes in Mathew 5:3-12. In the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches us how to be happy and challenges us to be our best.
- 7. (a) This saying comes from Matthew 5:38-39. Jesus' followers would have been familiar with the old law that Jesus is quoting. You can read it in Leviticus 24:19. But he's bringing them a new law, urging his followers to be peacemakers.
- **8. (b)** Even if you don't get caught, actions against the commandments are sins. But something that happens by accident is not a sin.
- **9.** (a) Cain and Abel were the sons of Adam and Eve. Cain murdered his brother Abel out of anger and jealousy. See Genesis 4:3-8.
- 10. (b) The Bible tells us that the commandments were written on stone tablets by the finger of God. See Exodus 31:18.

- 11. (c) In Matthew 5:1, we read that Jesus gave the Beatitudes to his disciples. *Disciple* is a word that means "student" and is used to describe those who hear and listen to the teaching of Jesus, not only in New Testament times, but in all ages.
- 12. (c) When Catholics gather in their parishes on Sundays to celebrate Mass, they are obeying the third commandment: "Remember to keep holy the LORD'S Day."
- 13. (a) "Love your neighbor as yourself" is the second part of what Jesus tells us is the greatest commandment. The first part is, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." (Matthew 22:36-39)

- 1. (d) Jesus tells us the greatest commandment is, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:36-39)
- **2. (a)** Mt. Sinal is the name of the mountain. See Exodus, chapters 19 and 20. Another name for the mountain is Mt. Horeb.
- **3. (b)** The fifth commandment forbids direct and intentional killing. Every human life is sacred because it was created by God.
- **4. (d)** Obeying the fourth commandment brings peace, especially when parents and leaders are mindful of God's law.
- **5. (d)** This commandment forbids greediness, which is the root of stealing and jealousy.
- **6. (a)** Our word *Beatitude* comes from the Latin word for "blessed" or "happy." It is only an accident that the word can also be read as *Be-attitudes*, but these are truly attitudes for being. You can read the Beatitudes in Matthew 5:3-10 and Luke 6:21-23.
- 7. (d) This commandment forbids desiring the spouse of another. It urges us to be pure at heart.
- **8. (d)** The virtue of modesty protects the inner person as well as the outer person. It helps us to control our actions, dress, and conversation.
- **9.** (a) This is one of the Beatitudes that Jesus gave us. See Matthew 5:9. We are never too young to learn to be peacemakers.
- **10. (b)** See Matthew 5:7. How does the message of this Beatitude compare with this part of the Lord's Prayer: "and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us"?

- 11. (d) This is the seventh commandment. It asks us to respect the property of other people as well as to respect all of creation.
- 12. (a) Taking the "name of the LORD your God in vain" extends to the improper use of Jesus' name and of the names of Mary and the saints.
- 13. (c) This is the sixth commandment. It forbids sins against chastity, which is a healthy, holy attitude toward sexuality. To be chaste is to accept our sexuality as a gift from God to be used wisely according to our state in life—married or single.
- 14. (d) The eighth commandment is concerned with truth, the basic building block of society. Lying hurts the liar and the person lied about. The lie has effects on others as well. Gossiping and spreading rumors are related to lying.



- 1. (a) In Matthew 25:35-46, Jesus tells his followers that, whenever they met the needs of others, they did these things to him. And in the same way, whenever they failed to meet the needs of others, they did these things to him.
- **2. (d)** The eighth commandment forbids all offenses against truthfulness.
- 3. (c) The Gospels tell us that even Jesus was obedient to his parents, Mary and Joseph. See Luke 2:51.
- **4. (c)** To covet means to want something so much that you are willing to commit a sin to get it. Coveting is a sin against both the ninth and tenth commandments.
- **5. (d)** The seventh commandment also forbids cheating on taxes, fraud in business dealings, and not doing your best at work or school. It urges us to use the gifts of creation well.
- **6. (a)** This is the first commandment, which tells us to worship only the one true God.
- 7. (b) This is the second commandment. Because the name of God is holy, we need always to respect it. This commandment also calls us to respect the names of Jesus, Mary, and all the saints.
- **8. (c)** In Matthew 5:1, we read that Jesus "went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them...." Chapters 5-7 of Matthew's Gospel contain the Beatitudes and many other teachings of Jesus.
- **9. (d)** Jesus taught that the fifth commandment includes anger, fighting, and insults. You can read Jesus' teaching in Matthew 5:21-24.
- 10. (b) See Matthew 5:4. Christians experience sorrow when they see that something or someone is standing in the way of building the kingdom of God. Mourning the victims of tragedy and injustice helps Christians to realize the brokenness of life and experience the personal call to change.

- 11. (b) Taking an oath, or swearing, is taking God as a witness to what you are saying. This involves using God's name. A false oath calls on God to be a witness to a lie.
- 12. (c) See Matthew 5:5. In this Beatitude, Jesus challenges us to identify with and work to help the poor, the oppressed, the outcast, and the powerless.
- **13.** (a) All of these practices are attempts to know and control the future, which is in the hands of God alone.
- 14. (c) In marriage the husband and wife promise to be faithful to each other. Adultery breaks that promise and is a serious sin.
- **15.** (a) Because blasphemy is contrary to the respect due God and his name, it is a sin against the second commandment.
