





A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Please scan the QR Code to sign up for FOOD DONATIONS.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time BEFORE the WEDNESDAY preceding the SECOND THURSDAY of the month.

PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin ON THAT WEDNESDAY BY 7:30am to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to SERVE the FHC lunch on that SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer.

The next donation date is WEDNESDAY, February 11, for the lunch that will be served on THURSDAY, February 12.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of NON-PERISHABLES are always welcome and may be put in the Bell Tower bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.




EUCARISTIC Adoration



"Fr. Matt is pastor of St. Gall & Chapel St. Simon in Chicago's Gage Park neighborhood. Ordained in 1989, Fr. Matt served St. Agatha in North Lawndale, before becoming pastor of Santiago Apostol in Guerrero, Mexico, serving 26 mountain villages. In 2000, he returned to Chicago, as pastor of St. Agnes of Bohemia in Little Village, with 9 Sunday Masses and 6,100 Sunday worshippers. Fr. Matt felt called to accompany US personnel in the Middle East. As a US Army Chaplain, Fr. Matt deployed to Afghanistan four times, serving with the 82nd Airborne, 101st Airborne and US Army Special Operations divisions. Following 5+ years in the Army, Fr. Matt became pastor of St. James Parish in Arlington Heights, while also administering Mission Juan Diego for a time."

Series - Pope Leo's *Dilexi Te* (On Love for the Poor)


What is the Church's teaching on immigration?

The answer is that the Church does not have a definitive teaching on the particulars of immigration policy. What the Church does have is a basic teaching about the inherent dignity of every person as a child of God, and general teachings, which ought to be applied to the current situation.

1. Political authorities, for the sake of the common good for which they are responsible, may make the exercise of the right to immigrate subject to various juridical conditions, especially with regard to the immigrants' duties toward their country of adoption. Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws, and to assist in carrying civic burdens (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2241).
2. As the Catechism notes (again in para. 2241): "The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin."
3. Christian charity requires each of us to treat all of those with whom we come into contact with the dignity that they deserve. This speaks, then, not so much to the question of immigration policy (that is, who is allowed to enter the country and under what conditions) but of how immigrants are to be treated once they have arrived.

Immigration policy is one of those areas in which we, as informed and well-formed Catholics, are to make prudential decisions, based on these principles, about the way forward. Neither the Pope nor the bishops have the definitive answer. This is the responsibility of the laity, having been formed by the teachings of the Church. As we go forward in our search for a just and respectful national policy on immigration, we can refer to these three principles.






Let us pray...
