A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Please scan the QR Code to sign up for FOOD DONATIONS.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the AJH bin in the Bell Tower (open M-F, 7a-3p) any time BEFORE the WEDNESDAY preceding the SECOND THURSDAY of the month.

PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin ON THAT WEDNESDAY BY 7:30am to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to SERVE the FHC lunch on that SECOND THURSDAY of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from 11:15 to 2:30 to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer.

The next donation date is WEDNESDAY, February 11, for the lunch that will be served on THURSDAY, February 12.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of NON-PERISHABLES are always welcome and may be put in the Bell Tower bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.


"Fr. Matt is pastor of St. Gall & Chapel St. Simon in Chicago's Gage Park neighborhood. Ordained in 1989, Fr. Matt served St. Agatha in North Lawndale, before becoming pastor of Santiago Apostol in Guerrero, Mexico, serving 26 mountain villages. In 2000, he returned to Chicago, as pastor of St. Agnes of Bohemia in Little Village, with 9 Sunday Masses and 6,100 Sunday worshippers. Fr. Matt felt called to accompany US personnel in the Middle East. As a US Army Chaplain, Fr. Matt deployed to Afghanistan four times, serving with the 82nd Airborne, 101st Airborne and US Army Special Operations divisions. Following 5+ years in the Army, Fr. Matt became pastor of St. James Parish in Arlington Heights, while also administering Mission Juan Diego for a time."



St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Series - Pope Leo's *Dilexi Te* (On Love for the Poor)


What is the pope's teaching on the economy?

In *Dilexi te*, Pope Leo says that the “dictatorship of an economy that kills” continues to prevail; the wealth of the few continues to grow “exponentially” while the gap between rich and poor increases; and “ideologies that defend the absolute autonomy of the marketplace and financial speculation” remain widespread” (92). All of this, Pope Leo says, indicates the continued existence of a “throwaway culture”, sometimes “well disguised”, that “tolerates with indifference that millions of people die of hunger or survive in conditions unfit for human beings” (96, 11).

Pope Leo thus calls for a “change in mentality”....Sometimes, Pope Leo observes, Christians allow themselves to succumb to attitudes shaped by “secular ideologies or political and economic approaches that lead to gross generalizations and mistaken conclusions” (15). Pope Leo warns that if “any Church community” does not cooperate “in helping the poor to live with dignity....It will easily drift into a spiritual worldliness camouflaged by religious practices, unproductive meetings and empty talk” (113).

Dilexi te calls us to reflect as individual Christians and as a faith community on how we are answering Christ's call to love and care for the poor. In it, Pope Leo calls upon Christians to not just talk, but act. Pope Leo defines “the poor” broadly in the document, to include “those who lack material means of subsistence; ...those who are socially marginalized...; those of moral and spiritual poverty;...those who have no rights, no space, no freedom,” no voice.




