



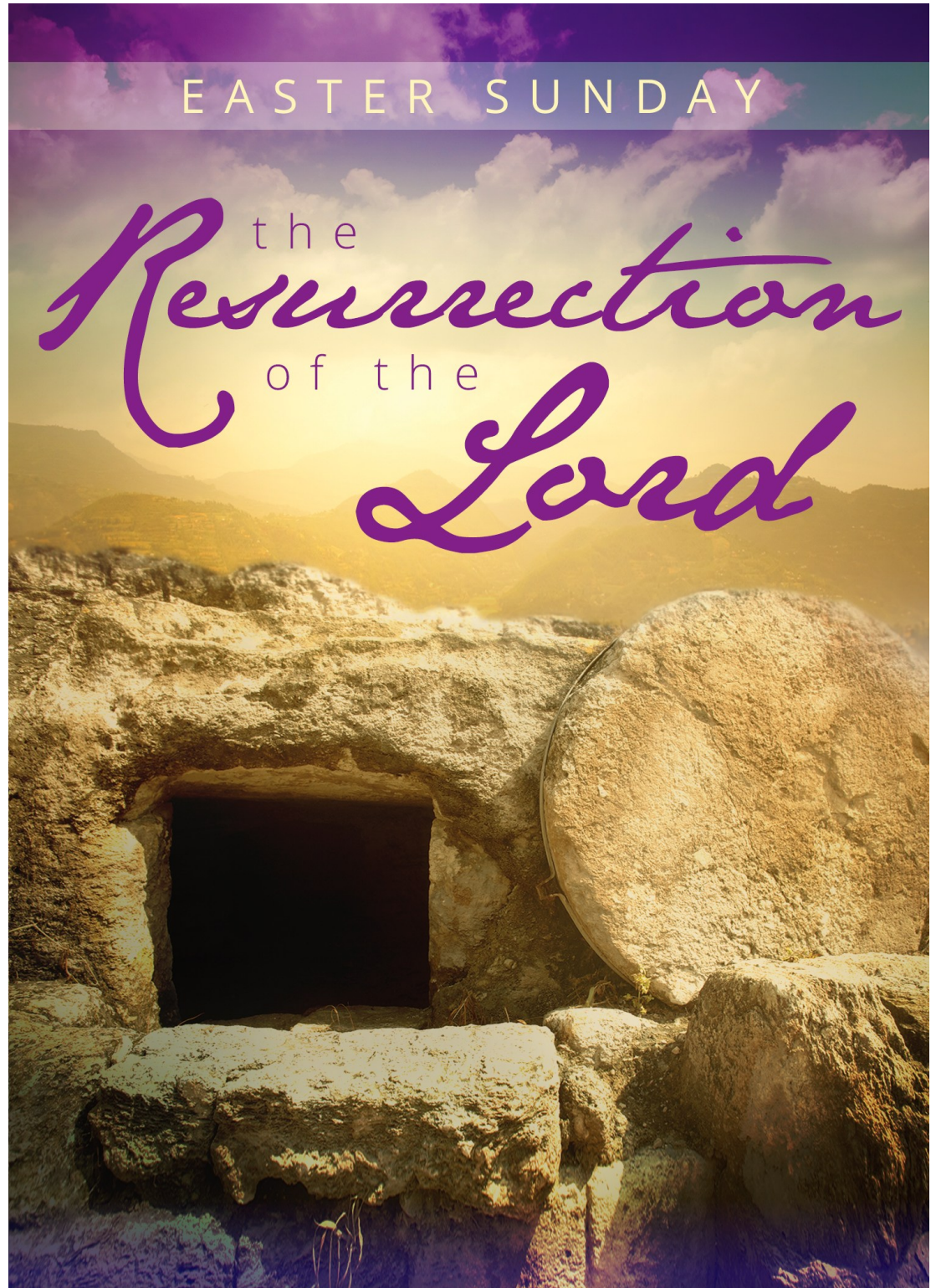

A Just Harvest serves a hot lunch every day. FHC donates the meal served on the **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Please use the SignUp below to sign up for **FOOD DONATIONS**.

NON-PERISHABLES may be dropped in the **AJH bin in the back of church** (open daily 7a-12p) any time **BEFORE** the **WEDNESDAY** preceding the **SECOND THURSDAY** of the month. **PERISHABLES MUST BE LEFT in the bin ON THAT WEDNESDAY BY 7:30am** to ensure they're usable when delivered that morning to the AJH kitchen.

VOLUNTEERS are also needed to **SERVE** the FHC lunch on that **SECOND THURSDAY** of each month. Volunteers are asked to be at AJH from **11:15 to 2:30** to help with set-up, lunch, and clean-up. Lunch is served 12-2. Each server is asked to bring 2-3 gallons of whole or 2% milk. **Servers should wear closed-toe shoes and slacks or jeans (no shorts or skirts please)**. Please use the SignUp below to volunteer to serve.

The next donation date is **WEDNESDAY, April 8**, for the lunch that will be served on **THURSDAY, April 9**.

AJH also runs a pantry, providing food to roughly 175 households every week. Donations of **NON-PERISHABLES** are always welcome and may be put in the bin. Suggested: canned chicken, tuna, fruit and vegetables; cereal, rice, pasta.

A NOTE FROM FR. BRIAN

“Sine Dominico Non Possumus” (Without Sunday we cannot live)

These bold words were spoken by a Catholic Christian in Tunisia in 304 A.D. when a court official asked him why he had broken the law forbidding Catholics from celebrating the Eucharist. Authorities that day arrested 49 men, women, and children for quietly gathering to celebrate Mass at a home, in secret. Even under threat, they understood that the “Lord’s Day” was never a burden or a mere rule — but the source of their strength and identity as Catholic Christians.



Easter Sunday is the day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Our Catholic faith is built on that foundational event. All our Catholic practices, devotions, celebrations and even the naming of Sunday itself stem from the resurrection of Jesus. After the resurrection, Sundays soon took on the name “The Lord’s Day” to commemorate the day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead, and as Catholics, we gather in church every Sunday to commemorate the Resurrection. We listen to the readings from Scripture, apply them to daily life, participate in the Eucharist — Christ’s gift to us, truly present in His Body and Blood — and give thanks to God for all we have received. Christ himself gathers us each week as a body of believers recalling we are saved in communion, with Jesus and each other.

Sunday Mass restores order to our lives. It places God and family at the center, rejuvenates us for the week ahead, strengthens the bonds of our families and parish, and protects us from the constant distractions that ultimately leave us restless. How? Through the power of the Resurrection and the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus’s presence is at once subtle and humble (appearance of bread and wine), yet powerful and able to transform (“I have come to give you life in abundance”).

Let us make the joy of this Easter Sunday the rhythm of every week. Let us continue to gather faithfully every “Lord’s Day” to commemorate Jesus’s victory over death and to be transformed, week by week.

Going forward, we will use this section of the bulletin to teach the different aspects of the Mass, and of our Catholic faith.

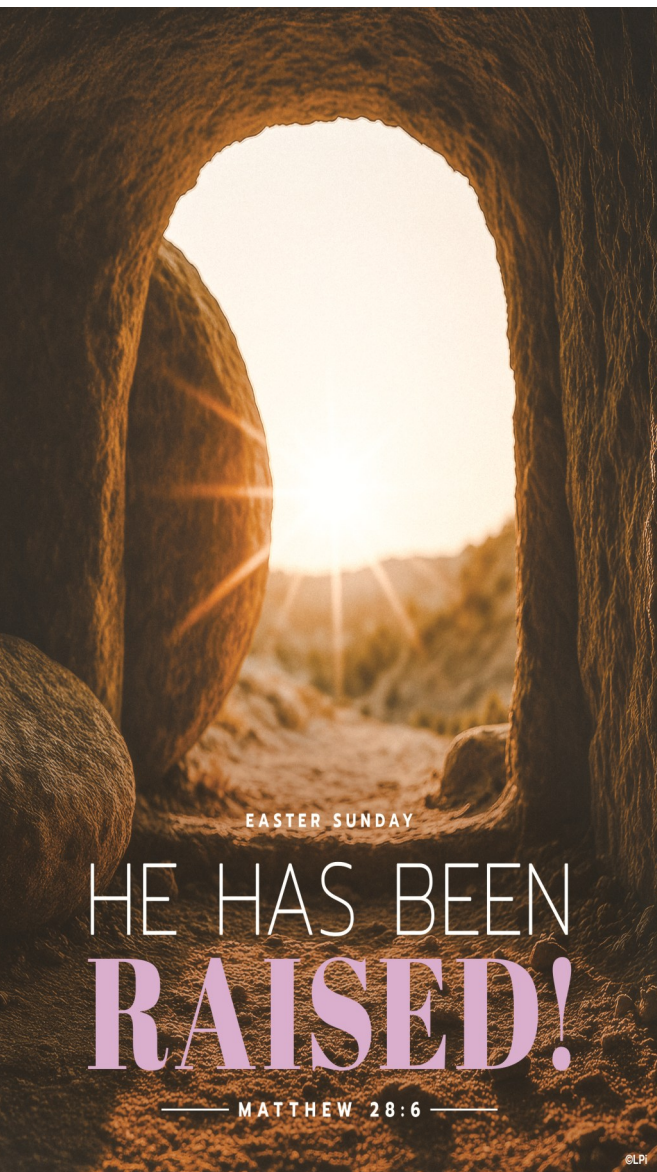



About Aid for Women

Aid for Women was founded in 1978 on the faith and teachings of the Catholic Church. Aid for Women helps thousands of women each year in the Chicago metropolitan area who find themselves facing unexpected pregnancies. Each woman is provided with the emotional, practical and spiritual support that she needs to choose life for her unborn baby and to provide a better future for herself and her child. Aid for Women currently operates five Pregnancy Care Centers, as well as two Maternity Homes (Heather's House and Monica's House).



About Faith Hope & Carpenters

Faith Hope and Carpenters (FHC) is our Parish volunteer team that works with Rebuilding Together North Suburban Chicago, to restore and rehab homes for needy families with children, the elderly, those with disabilities and veterans who live in the northern suburbs and have few resources to make the needed repairs to their homes. FHC has been providing this service for over 19 years. The 2025 project was to help a senior citizen de-clutter, organize and clean both the interior and exterior of her home. Over thirty volunteers from FHC and a dozen students from Loyola Academy participated in this project. The volunteers made significant improvements to the home and helped the homeowner improve her quality of life. Stay tuned for details on this year's project. We are ever grateful for your care and support!



About FHC Food Sharing Program

The **FHC Food Sharing Program** helps to support several food pantries and soup kitchens in the Chicagoland area. The food distribution from these pantries serves over 15,000 families and individuals every year! In addition, there is also a mobile food pantry that brings the available food items out to various locations for pickup a couple times per month. The Soup Kitchens provide meals at several kitchens that benefit from our Food Sharing program, but essentially dinner is served 7-days per week, and each location providing meals can serve anywhere from 95 to 200 people per evening! Our partnership continues to need your support!

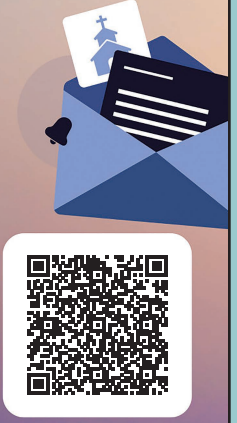
